## Fee Inclusions



### Annual Tuition Fees

Tuition fees are billed annually with options to pay in instalments. These fees are inclusive of the core cost of tuition, stationery, excursions and camps for your child, and many materials, texts and other costs.

The Years 7-9 tuition fee includes a rental fee for the take-home Chromebook. A \$500 'Lease to Own' fee is included for the Years 10-12 MacBook. Some other charges may apply to optional activities and specific classes of choice such as VCE classes, and some supplementary resources.



### VCE-VM & VET Subsidies

VCE-VM tuition fees are lower than VCE fees to reflect the additional fees required for VET courses. VET courses receive only limited government support toward the external cost of provision. Any relevant funding received is used to reduce per student costs, but additional course or materials costs set by the RTO Provider have to be met by parents. These VET fees are added to family fee accounts. Parents should seek confirmation of fees from the VET Coordinator prior to enrolment.

VCE students who also enrol in an external VET course will receive a \$1,500 subsidy upon successful completion of their course.



### Camps & Outdoor Education

Year level camps and excursions are included in College tuition fees. Extra charges may apply for non-compulsory excursions or camps, or for those related to specific elective classes of choice.



# The Bayside Foundation

Over the past 40 years, College families have faithfully ensured they have paid their tuition fees and, in partnership with parents, the Board has worked to keep tuition fees as low as possible. However, fee payments only finance the College from one year to the next.

To ensure we can continue to serve our students and families for the next 40 years, we have introduced the Bayside Foundation. The Foundation provides a way for current families to invest into the future of the College in two key ways: the Bursary Fund and the Building Fund.

Both these funds are designed to enable the College to assist in providing an opportunity for more families to access Christian education. ## Payment Options

A variety of payment frequencies are available including yearly, half-yearly, quarterly, monthly and fortnightly. Payment options include:

- Direct debit by the College
- Internet (BPay, bank transfer)
- In person (credit card)
- Cash/cheque payments paid directly into our ANZ Bank Account at an ANZ Branch.

## Sibling Discounts

Sibling discounts are applied to the second and third child in the family. Fourth and subsequent children are not charged College tuition fees.

## Government Discounts

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund is a Victorian Government means-tested allowance to assist families with a current Pension or Health Care Card. Eligible fee discounts are \$125 per Primary or \$225 per Secondary student. Families can apply through the Finance Office.

## Conveyance Allowance

Families who drive more than 4.8 kilometres to the College (by the shortest practical route) may be eligible for a Conveyance (Travel) Allowance. See the Finance Office to complete a Conveyance Allowance form.

## College Bus Passes

\$900 Full Bus Pass (return trip) or \$450 Half Bus Pass (one trip per day) per student per year less any Conveyance Allowance. Casual use tickets can be purchased for \$5 one-way.

## Withdrawal from the College

A minimum of one full term's notice in writing is required. A full term's fees are charged when less than one full term's notice is provided.
